They have learned to scan, test, enter and secure different systems, but also to implement real security audits.

The CHFI course will benefit Police and other law enforcement personnel, Defense and Military personnel, e-Business Security professionals, Systems administrators, Legal professionals, Banking, Insurance and other professionals, Government agencies etc.
