SEACOM- three years later, Africa is more interconnected

When SEACOM launched its fiber optic network along the East African coast in 2009, expectations were high that it would lead to lower connectivity costs, businesses and infrastructure growth in the region. Three years later, it has not disappointed.

Immediately after entry, connectivity costs fell from \$3,500 per Mbps to \$500 per Mbps and this gave businesses in the region a lifeline with the reduction of operational, travel costs for those with a large footprint and accelerated growth of smaller businesses offering applications and online services.
