Workshop on Domain Names and Trademarks, Cotonou Benin

This premier event in Africa was successfully conducted in Cotonou Benin in May 5-6, 2014. Benin's Minister for ICT, Komi Koutche and David Olive, ICANN's VP for Policy Development Support and GM of our Istanbul hub opened the event. Akram Atallah, ICANN's President of the Global Domain Division also delivered a video message to the audience.

More than 70 participants from various professional backgrounds – ccTLD managers (more than 25 African ccTLDs/countries), government representatives, African registrars, African I* groups such as AfriNIC, AFTLD, AFRALO, African ICT business sector, intellectual property and trademark experts from Africa attended the event.
