Workshop Theme: Enhancing Local Engagement in Internet Governance in Africa

1. Introduction

Internet Governance Youth Community (YouthCam) workshop initiative targets to introduce the youth from various backgrounds in Tanzania not only to ICANN but the wider Internet ecosystem with an aim of ensuring this new audience, are prepared early enough to help them participate effectively in the internet ecosystem.

The overarching objectives of this workshop is to promote local engagement of African communities in Internet Governance, create awareness about ICANN and build capacity of African local community towards addressing future challenge of the internet in Africa.

The University of Dodoma (UDOM) desires to be an Information and Communication Technology driven institution and a catalyst of change in ICT industry in Tanzania and beyond. College of Informatics and Virtual Education (CIVE) has been mandated to deliver academic and professional programs, offer public services and conduct research in ICT.

UDOM through CIVE is pleased to announce a partnership with ICANN, ICANNWiki and Amazon to host a three days Internet Governance Capacity Building YouthCam workshop in Tanzania.

2. Workshop Objectives and Outcomes

Generally, Internet Governance is the development of norms and principles relating to how the Internet functions by a group of stakeholders: governments, academia, civil societies, business enterprises, technical communities and end users. It is the conversations around access, policy and content of internet. In Africa, internet has brought a paradigm shift in public engagement in diverse sectors of economy despite the fact that a large percentage of African populations do not have access or have limited access to the internet. Therefore, increasing the engagement level of local African communities in Internet governance through localized language content such as Swahili will serve as a boost for technology innovation, technology transfer, and productive use of internet to address economic, social and political development of African communities.
