The value of this attribute is an “abuse-mailbox”, which must be a valid e-mail address. ▪ The proposal appears to replace the current optional IRT (specified as the “mnt-irt” attribute whose value is an “irt” whois database object) ▪ A mechanism to validate the “abuse-mailbox” and report invalid ones is also proposed. 	12.08.2018	Under Discussion

Key highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Only legacy IPv4 or ASN resources can be transferred from AFRINIC to other regions. ▪ Once transferred, incoming legacy resources lose the legacy status. ▪ All transfers must go through and satisfy a needs assessment. ▪ Transferred resources cannot be transferred again until after 1 year of most recent transfer. ▪ IPv6 resources can only be transferred after 2 years of issue. 	26.10.2018	Under Discussion
